It is important that students in grade 6 begin to develop strong study habits and be responsible for their own learning. Students are expected to review their notes at home a few times a week to stay on top of their learning and help retain the information covered in class. Assessment

Student grades will be available on PowerSchool via live reporting throughout the school year. Please view it on a regular basis to check on progress, read teacher comments on specific tests/projects, as well as to stay up to date on any missing assignments. Our hope is that by providing this information on an ongoing basis throughout the year, we can stay ahead of any issues that may arise and promote optimal learning. Due to the 24/7 live reporting, a traditional report card will not be issued until the end of the school year. Due dates for assignments/projects will be clearly communicated with students. While we expect our students to be responsible for their learning and meet these deadlines, we understand life can get in the way. We will do our best to accommodate each situation on an individual basis.

Grades are calculated cumulatively, which means that as each assignment or quiz is added on a student's record, the overall average and final mark is adjusted. Please be aware that the grade may fluctuate throughout the year as the curriculum intensifies.
