



Antonym

An Antonym = opposite meaning!

Slow ----- Fast



Work ----- Relax



Synonym

Similar Synonyms

Words with almost the same meaning.

Small – Tiny, Little, Miniature, Minute



Large – immense, huge, over sized

*Jill's feet were **large**. They were so*

***immense** she had to*

*have **huge** shoes.*



Homonym

Homonyms are words that sounds the same as one another but each means something different. It is important that you understand the difference in order for the sentence to make sense!



I **write** with my **right** hand!

I **ate eight** cookies today!

I **made** my mom hire a **maid** so I wouldn't have to clean my room!



Synecdoche

Synecdoche is when a part of something is used to refer to the whole thing.

“ A **foot** in the door.”

Meaning a way in somewhere. For example “If I can get my foot in the door and they hire me then I can move up to be a manager.” Foot is being used in speech to represent the whole body.



Metaphors

A metaphor compares two things by saying that one is something else.

That man is a moose, he is so strong!



Onomatopoeia

Words that imitate sounds!



Quack

Splash

Bang

Sizzle



ALLITERATION

Repeat of a letter or sound !



*Sam sat sipping soda in the
sizzling sun.*




Similes



Comparing two things using **like** or **as**....

Ed was shaking **like** a leaf he was so scared!



She smiled down **like**
the sun on all the new
students.

Personification

- When non-human (animals, objects or ideas) are described as if they were human.

The birds sang. The wind howled.



HYPERBOLE

- A figure of speech in which exaggeration is used for emphasis or effect.

This book weighs a ton!
